Have your say, we're listening

Ramsgate Terrace, Mairangi Bay – Raised Pedestrian Crossing

Kia ora,

Aucklanders have told us that moving around our city safely and easily is important to them. Hibiscus and Bays Local Board and Auckland Transport are proposing some improvements to your area.

We have received concerns from the community about safety on Ramsgate Terrace and in order to improve this we are proposing to upgrade the existing speed table to a raised pedestrian crossing.

You can help shape these improvements

Listening to what you have to say is important to us. Your local knowledge can help us make better decisions, so together we can achieve the best outcomes for your neighbourhood.

The changes we are proposing:

- Upgrade the existing speed table to a raised pedestrian crossing.
- Extend the broken yellow lines (no stopping at all times) to the east of the crossing. This will remove 6 car parking spaces.
- Paint new road markings and install signs to support the crossing.
- Install tactile pavers which are yellow guidance paving markers to help visually impaired people find their way to the crossing and safely cross the road.
- Widen and reconstruct the footpath at either side of the crossing.

How this will benefit your neighbourhood

Auckland Transport, local boards and ward councillors are working together to tackle local road safety concerns and would like to work with you to deliver safer roads in your neighbourhood. These changes will provide a safe crossing point and aim to slow driving speeds and increase awareness of people crossing at this location.

Removing some on-street parking is necessary to support these changes by ensuring that parked cars do not block the view of the crossing and pedestrians. We understand that removing parking can be inconvenient, so we have minimised the removal.

Auckland Transport is taking a Vision Zero approach to road safety. This means we are striving to have zero deaths or serious injuries on our transport system by 2050. To achieve this, we are working to create a more forgiving road network that recognises that we are human and make mistakes. But those mistakes should not mean someone dies or is seriously injured on our roads.

- We'll listen to all the feedback we receive, and then decide the best way to move forward.
- Auckland Council has implemented an Emergency Budget which has reduced AT's capital and operating budgets. We are seeking feedback now so that we can be prepared once the funding for this project is given the go ahead.
- We'll post the outcome of this proposal and a summary of community feedback on our website.

More information

This proposal is supported by the Community Safety Fund which is a \$20 million programme focussed on tackling road safety concerns raised by the community. Auckland Transport is partnering with [Hibiscus and Bays Local Board](#) and Ward Councillors to deliver this project, which is part of more than 80 locally funded safety improvement projects across Auckland.

This work will also be funded by the Auckland regional fuel tax.
